2. Environmental Protection

Flora & Fauna

Encouraging Responsible Interaction with Nature

• Visitors are supported to stay screen-free, stick to designated paths, and develop a deeper appreciation for the environment.

Camping Restrictions & Fire Safety Measures

• Camping is restricted to designated zones and rotated as needed to reduce wear. Fire pits are managed carefully, and total fire bans are strictly observed during bushfire season.

Visitor Number Limits

Capacity limits help protect sensitive areas from overuse and degradation.

Pet Restrictions

• To safeguard native wildlife, pets are not permitted (with the exception of accredited assistance dogs).



3. Emissions Reduction

Nature-Based, Low-Impact Activities

• Orienteering, bushwalking, bouldering and obstacle courses require little built infrastructure and encourage natural engagement.

Screen-Free Programs

• By disconnecting from digital devices, guests reconnect with nature and reduce associated energy use.

Shared Fire Pits & Communal Experiences

• Fire pit use is communal and seasonal, promoting energy-conscious outdoor enjoyment.

Minimal Onsite Services

• Guests are encouraged to bring their own food and supplies, reducing packaging waste and transport-related emissions.

Unpowered Camping

• All tent camping zones remain unpowered, reducing unnecessary energy consumption.

Efficient Shared Facilities

• Gas BBQs and shared bathrooms reduce resource use, while air-conditioned cabins are used consciously during hot weather.

Digital Detox Focus

• Minimal technology use supports an energy-conscious guest experience.

Sustainability Accreditation

 Woodhouse holds Sustainable Tourism Accreditation, demonstrating alignment with industry environmental standards.
